

**BEFORE THE FAIRMOUNT FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT
BOARD OF DIRECTORS
RESOLUTION OPPOSING AMENDMENTS 60, 61
AND PROPOSITION 101**

WHEREAS, (3) three measures appearing on the November 2010 statewide ballot will significantly and negatively impact FAIRMOUNT FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT ("District") in funding a basic level of services related to fire protection, and

WHEREAS, these measures drastically limit the District's ability to construct, improve or expand fire stations and acquire firefighting equipment;

WHEREAS, one of the many components of Amendment 60 would overturn election decisions made by voters over the last eighteen (18) years, creating financial chaos for the District, and;

WHEREAS, Proposition 101 reduces the vehicle registration fee (annual license plate fee) to a level which would devastate Colorado's ability to maintain safe roads and bridges, by lowering the fee to the assessment rate from the year 1919; which, in turn, will increase responses by District to traffic incidents, and

WHEREAS, these measures individually and collectively, significantly reduce or otherwise restrict both state and local revenues in a number of different ways, including but not limited to: Specific ownership taxes, telecommunication taxes, state income taxes, state-shared revenues to assist municipalities with local street and transit improvements, other state grants and loans to help local government including fire district's, and property taxes; and


WHEREAS, the cumulative and destructive nature of the three (3) measures ensures that Colorado will surrender its competitive standing to attract large and small employers alike, resulting in little to no economic growth for the State and a steady decline in property values and erosion of the state and local tax base;

WHEREAS, State voters will have the opportunity on November 2, 2010 to protect the fiscal health of Colorado by defeating Proposition 101, Amendment 60 and Amendment 61;

NOW THEREFORE, the District Board takes an official position opposing Amendments 60, 61 and Proposition 101, and urges District residents to assure the provision of state of the art, high quality fire protection service by voting NO on all 3 ballot measures.
